Following the previous editions held at the Higher Institute of Educational Sciences in Luanda (ISCED-Luanda), Angola (2019), at the Zambeze University (UniZambeze, Beira), Mozambique (2021) and at the Universidad del Atlántico (UA, Barranquilla), Colombia (2022), the IV International Conference which, this year, is entitled African, Ibero-American and Caribbean Literatures and Cultures, appeals to the submission of final texts (according to the editorial rules indicated below) that respect one of the indicated themes. The submission of the proposal requires an application fee.

This edition, which aims to honor Maria Teresa Segredo, a nurse from the island of Santo Antão, Cape Verde, decorated by the Queen of the Netherlands, and José Luís Hopffer Almada, poet, essayist and jurist, born in the island of Santiago, Cape Verde, in the logic of previous editions, seeks to set up a space for dialogue and construction of international research networks, discussing contemporary themes that cut across various areas of knowledge, from linguistic and sociocultural policies in African, Ibero-American and Caribbean spaces, passing through the problematization of intellectual history, the book and culture, publishing, the arts and the impact of women's writing in the field of thought(s) and contemporary struggles for their rights.

Based on these considerations, the organization invites the submission of proposals for complete articles in Portuguese, Cape Verdean, English and Spanish, on the following thematic panels around which the reflections will be organized:

- Academia, civil society and volunteering.
- José Luís Hoppfer Almada and his contribuition to Cape Verdean literature.



- Studies on the Cape Verdean language.
- Critical reflection on Cape Verdean literature: from the beginning to the present.
- Migrations, imaginary and transatlantic movements.
- Cultures, literatures and transatlantic identities in a historical perspective.
- Pluriversalisms and Peripheral Dialogues: Philosophy, Literature and Aesthetics in the Global South.
- Literatures of the transgressive body.
- Dictatorships, neocolonialisms, resistance and decoloniality.
- Feminisms in the Global South: impact of women's writing on understanding literature and its critical perspectives.
- State, trajectories and challenges of comparative literary studies.
- Literary production and cinema.
- Press, literature, translation and publishing.
- Colonial press and cultural movements in Africa.
- Inquisitorial processes in Africa/America: memories, testimonies and archives.
- Academic Traditions: Encounters and Disagreements in Theory and Literary Criticism.
- Archive construction processes (literary, historical, artistic, etc.).
- The place of *otrx*: dissent and otherness in literature.
- Militarisms, dictatorships, political extremisms and internal colonialisms in contemporary literatures.
- Identity belonging and language conceptions.
- Sea ports and oral tradition in the Atlantic.
- Impact of musicians and composers.
- Post colonial literature.
- Art and performances as a reflection of everyday life.
